Our 2022 Strategic Improvement Plan

Our Executive team have begun drafting our 2022 strategic implementation plan and will begin staff consultation during our School Development Days. We will also invite our Year 6

students and Student Representative Council to contribute to the strategic improvement plan. Once our first draft is complete, we will be inviting our P&C Executive and interested parents to take part in the consultation and review process.

Parent and carer survey on consent education

Students across NSW, both past and present, have called for improved consent education following a petition by former Sydney student Chanel Contos. Consent is saying yes to something happening or agreeing to do something freely; without fear, force or pressure. In response to the voices of young people, the heads of the three education sectors signed a Statement of Intent . In this Statement, the NSW Department of Education committed to a number of actions – including partnering with parents and carers to improve consent education. There is now an opportunity for parents and carers to have their say by completing a short survey.

The anonymous survey will help the NSW Department of Education to understand the kinds of resources parents and carers would find helpful in having important conversations about consent with their children – so that we can continue to work together to make sure every student has the knowledge and skills they need to form respectful relationships. This survey is available in 10 languages other than English and will take less than 10 minutes to complete. The results will be shared on NSW Department of Education website later this year. More information, including answers to frequently asked questions, is also available on the website. The survey will close on 15th December 2021. Parents and carers of NSW Public School students of all ages, from all communities, are encouraged to participate in **the survey**.

Compulsory School Attendance Guidelines

The Department's Compulsory School guidelines are included in the link below. The guidelines include expectations for daily attendance, punctuality and gaining principal permission for travel leave outside of the school holidays. For part-day exemptions, these need Director approval and can only be endorsed in blocks of 5 weeks. Please read through the advice so that you are aware of the policy requirements. 



Automated Pedestrian Gate 1

Our new automated pedestrian gate at Gate 1 is now in operation.



Please be aware that Gate 1 will be open from 8am to 9.30am and 2.30pm to 3.30pm daily.

Should you need to enter the school at other times during the day – please press the buzzer – wait for the Admin office to respond – then wait until the gate opens before entering.

Please DO NOT push or pull on the gate.

You will also need to press the buzzer when exiting and wait for the Admin office to respond – again, please wait until the gate opens before exiting.

Attendance

Student attendance records will be closely monitored. If your child is absent, it is important that a note/certificate explaining their absence is given to the classroom teacher when your child returns to school. Parents/Carers will be given a letter if an explanation is not provided for the student's absence and this must be completed and returned to the classroom teacher so that the student's attendance records will be updated accordingly.

Student Absences

The Department of Education deems that all students must attend school every day. Families are also advised that holidays should be taken during school holiday periods.

If your child is absent from school please notify the school in writing by either sending an email to the school email or sending a note to the class teacher explaining the absence.

If your child is sick for one day, you DO NOT need to ring the school but can send a note to school with your child on the following day.

Absences are recorded in the class roll and this roll is admissible as evidence in a court of law.

- Partial absences are also recorded in the roll, where a child arrives late to school or leaves school early.
- If a student is late to school, a parent should escort them to the office so they can give the reason for the late arrival.
- Students, who are constantly late to school, miss the morning lesson introduction and this can lead to gaps in learning.



Please endeavour to maximize your child's attendance at school to ensure that they have the best start possible, every day!

If you are intending to take leave for more than three days, and you know in advance, it is important that this be discussed with the school as an application for leave may be required. If your child is absent for longer than three days it is important that you contact the school to let them know the reason for the absence.

Preschool

Early Stage 1

These last few weeks in kindergarten, we have been learning about fractions!

We made fractions flowers and had to cut the centre of the flowers into the correct fraction such as whole, half, quarters and thirds.

Stage 1




1G have been integrating what they have been learning in science into literacy groups.

Students designed different weather instruments such as a rain gauge, wind sock and thermometer. They included a detailed annotated diagram that labelled their design with materials they could use to construct their weather instrument.



Students in 1G have been consolidating their phonemic knowledge by practicing the spelling rule in their spelling words. Students really enjoy using magnetic letters, white boards and markers to read and recreate spelling words.





Students in 1N have been showing some amazing work while learning remotely and Mr Nunan is very proud of their perseverance to complete and participate in all aspects of learning. Perseverance has been a theme which 1N analysed as part of their PDH lesson for the week, where students identified what it means to persevere and why it is an important strength.

In literacy, students have looked at how to structure their narrative writing and explored the use of adjectives to give their stories emphasis and feeling for the reader to connect with. Great job 1N!

2A have had an exciting week being back in the classroom with some students joining us online via zoom. This week we have been learning about the ever changing seasons in Australia and comparing them to other countries from all over the world. We have also been investigating Area as part of our Mathematics and creating shapes to show the exact areas and then comparing the sizes. This week in Literacy we have been learning about the various components that make up a Narrative and coming up with some very imaginative pieces of writing. As part of our PDH lessons we have been looking at the concept of perseverance and why it is such an impart strength.

2R have been applying their knowledge of division and fractions into their daily lives by showing equal groups of objects and equal sharing of items. They even had fun creating shapes on geoboards and showing different fractions.



Students in 2R applied their scientific skills and created weather instruments.

Stage 1 Teachers

Stage 2 and 3

English

In 3P, we are learning about Earth and space.

During our writing lessons, we have completed a procedural text and an acrostic poem about this topic. Our procedural text explained how to create a sundial, and our acrostic poems were about the day and night cycle!

We built our vocabulary as we planned the procedural text, with a focus on materials used, action verbs, adverbs and time connectives that would be used in our writing. For our imaginative acrostic poem, we learnt about poetic devices such as personification, similes, metaphors and rhyming – can you spot them?



Maths

This fortnight, we have been focusing on our Multiplication and Division as well as Fractions and Decimals.

We showed our mathematical thinking while solving word problems involving multiplying and dividing. We successfully used long division as a new strategy to help us divide larger numbers of up to three digits!

Using number lines has been a great way for us to visualise and compare unit fractions and round numbers to two decimal places.







Art

While learning about Earth and space, we completed an abstract artwork based on the Sun.

We explored the use of different patterns, shapes, textures and types of lines such as spirals, curves, polka dots and zig zags.

Support Unit

K-6 W students have enjoyed being back at school. We have focussed on developing relationships and reconnecting with each other. As a class we have been talking about seven habits and revisiting our class mission statement every day.

The students have been working very hard to develop and build new concepts and skills. For Literacy, we have been working on identifying high frequency sight words and have been practicing writing simple sentences. For Numeracy, we

have been completing the given patterns and have also been understanding the concepts of halves and quarters.





Students have enjoyed various classroom discussions and activities including making poppies for Remembrance Day, enjoying the zoom dance sessions, and creating beautiful craft. They all have started working on the end of year Christmas craft as they eagerly await their favourite festival Christmas.

Appointments are also now available for those aged 12 - 15 who are National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) participants, have health conditions, identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander or who live in a rural area.

The risk of COVID-19 in the community is high. It can cause serious illness and death. You can't predict who will get very unwell.





Staff Car Park

Student Toilets

Please be advised that all school notes and written communication are now placed on our website for your easy access. Families that have requested multiple copies will now need to access the website. We are encouraging the use of technology @ SHWPS!

Important

It would be appreciated, if when completing permission notes, you could include the child's FULL NAME (Given Name and Surname) AND CLASS, in order for the office to correctly identify the student who is participating in the special activity.

Sending money to school

If paying by cash or cheque, payment envelopes are available to allow office staff to quickly record details for our students.

A reminder: A permission note must be completed for every student in the family for all activities. Please note the office does not carry change. Please provide the correct money with your payments. We encourage families to pay using our POP – Payment online system via our school website.

Collection of Money and Permission Notes

To ensure that students' needs are met on excursions, extra curricula activities and for visiting performances, it is necessary

to have procedures in place regarding payments and permission notes. These procedures allow teachers to:

- Ensure that the correct number of teachers are allocated to an activity or excursion
- Buses are ordered for the right number of students
- Book correct numbers for all activities on excursions
- Organise supervision for students not involved in these activities
- Cancel activities if numbers are too low, within a reasonable timeframe.

It will also allow the office staff to have correct numbers, permission notes and money organised before the day of the activity or excursion.

These procedures include any area where money is paid to the school e.g. Excursions, visiting performances, sporting events, book club etc.

For this to be implemented correctly all money must be paid to front office by the DUE DATE, there will be no exceptions.

Permission notes, fully completed with child's name and class, must be given to the front office once you have made your payment online, or at the same time as money is presented.

In cases of financial hardship, the school may be able to assist by contributing a part payment.


