KEY CURRICULUM TOPICS/FOCUS AREA

English	Students will be exploring rich texts, subject-based texts and multimodal type texts through the implementation of L3. This program support the explicit teaching of key aspects of reading through the development of informed, systematic, explicit instruction. This term students will also develop their writing skills.

Science	In this science unit of work, students will be provided with practical, hands-on experiences to develop their understanding of all the basic needs of living things – food, water, shelter and air. Students will be afforded opportunities to recognise how people look after a pet to meet its basic needs. Focus questions help identify what senses the animal uses to help meet those needs. Students use the experience to create a model of a pet and identify how they would meet its needs. Through caring for a class pet/s as well as growing seeds, students observe firsthand how to meet the needs of animals and plants and consider the consequences of their needs not being met. Students analyse their own needs and are guided to recognise that sometimes wants are confused with needs. They are also guided to see that all basic needs must be met, not just some of them. Finally, students extrapolate what they have learned to an animal that lives in the wild. They consider how bilbies have to provide for their own needs and also learn about the senses that help them to do so. A class science journal is used as a tool for recording the students' learning journey and provides for meaningful literacy modelling.			
Personal Development and Health (PDH)	Personal Identity During Physical Development and Health, students will be investigating how their individual uniqueness shapes who they are. This unit aims to provide opportunities for students to reflect upon and describe personal strengths and achievements that contribute to their personal identity. Throughout the term, students will describe and practise ways to develop caring and respectful relationships with others to make them feel valued.			
Physical Education (PE)	Gymnastics – Fit Futures - Mondays This term students will participate in Gymnastics with trained educators from 'Fit Fitness'. This program specialises in building the confidence of all children in the area of gymnastics. Students will be provided with a firm foundation of the fundamental loco-motor and non-loco-motor gymnastics skills, and give them the opportunity to progress at their own pace. High quality specialised equipment is provided including a huge carpeted foam floor, trampoline, bars, rings, beam and wedges to ensure safety and appropriate execution of skills.

	Music	
Creative Arts and Performing Arts (CAPA)	This term, students will be engaging in music through singing playing and	
	moving to simple songs and speech rhymes. They will keep the beat and	
	sense of rhythm to known music and with tapping sticks and with their own	
	body percussion. Through exploring percussion instruments with familiar	
	songs, students will recognise and keep the beats, recognising verse and	
	chorus.	
Geography	In Geography, students will explore the geographical inquiry process and	
	identify the importance of places that students belong to and why they are	
	special. Through investigation of a local geographical issue, students will	
	examine why people need to take care for these places. Students use the	
	geographical concepts of place and space to develop geographical	
	understandings and geographical skills by observing, collecting, recording	
	and representing geographical data and information to answer inquiry	
	questions. This unit provides opportunities for guided fieldwork in the	
	school grounds using data collection techniques of observing, taking	
	photographs, drawing pictures and creating story maps. Opportunities exist	
	for the use of spatial technologies such as Google Earth.	
Library	During Library students will be exposed to high quality texts, participate in	
	the borrowing of Library books.
