English	Through the reading of a shared classroom novel, students will explore the English Textual Concepts of Code and Convention, Context, Point of View, Authority, Perspective and Argument. Students will apply Focus on Reading (FoR) comprehension strategies enabling them to implement the range of skills they require for comprehension. The program supports the explicit teaching of key aspects of reading through the development of informed, systematic, explicit instruction.

	Students will describe ways that scientific knowledge helps people			
	understand the effect of their actions on the environment and on the survival			
	of living things. Students will investigate the pivotal role that insects as small

	humankind? They will discover that there are more than 1500 plant species in			
	Australia that rely on ants for seed dispersal to continue their life cycle.

	The Marvellous micro-organisms unit links science with literacy in the			
	classroom. It provides opportunities for students to develop an			
	understanding of the role of micro-organisms in food and medicine. Students			
	investigate the conditions micro-organisms need to grow, learn about yeast			
	and the bread-making process, and research the development of penicillin.

Personal Development and Health (PDH)	Personal Identity During Personal Development and Health, students will be investigating how their uniqueness changes over time. The unit aims to provide opportunities for students to reflect upon how personal strengths and qualities contribute to identity and inform views, discuss how personal and cultural identity can change over time, eg influence of media.	
Physical Education (PE)	Gymnastics – Fit Futures This term students will participate in Gymnastics with trained educators from 'Fit Futures'. This program specialises in building the confidence of all children in the area of gymnastics. Students will be provided with a firm foundation of the fundamental loco-motor and non-loco-motor gymnastics skills, and give them the opportunity to progress at their own pace. High quality specialised equipment is provided including a huge carpeted foam floor, trampoline, bars, rings, beam and wedges to ensure safety and appropriate execution of skills.	
Creative Arts and Performing Arts (CAPA)	Visual Arts The Visual Arts unit "Abstractable Me" will allow students to study artists and create their own abstract artwork in either 2D or 3D in response to their lived experience through experimentation with media and form. Throughout the unit students will be engaged in both making and responding to various art formats.	
History	Year 4 First Contacts Students will study the unit 'First Contacts'. The unit introduces world history and the movements of peoples. Beginning with the history of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, students examine European exploration and colonisation in Australia and throughout the world up to the early 1800s. Students examine the impact of exploration on other societies, how these societies interacted with newcomers, and how these experiences contributed to their cultural diversity. Year 5 & 6 The Australian Colonies During History students will explore the unit 'The Australian Colonies'. The topic provides a study of colonial Australia in the 1800s. Students look at the founding of British colonies and the development of a colony. They learn about what life was like for different groups in the colonial period. They examine significant events and people, political and economic developments, social structures and settlement patterns.	
Library	During Library students will be exposed to high quality texts, participate in the borrowing of Library books and engage in a computer skills program that includes word processing, keyboard operation, sending and receiving e-mails and creating electronic presentations, preparing them to be future focussed learners.
