Topics for Term 1

In 2023, SHWPS is implementing Transdisciplinary Curriculum throughout the school. A transdisciplinary curriculum encourages students to learn to appreciate knowledge, conceptual understandings, skills and personal attributes as a connected whole. Our school collaboratively develops a program of inquiry to reflect the unique aspects of that school's community. The program of inquiry is organised and framed by six transdisciplinary themes:

These transdisciplinary themes together provide children with authentic learning experiences that are not confined to the boundaries of traditional subjects. Although subjects play an important role in learning, learners explore real-world problems by going beyond subject boundaries. Students have opportunities to reflect on the significance of their learning to take meaningful action in their community and the wider world. Students will showcase and assess their understanding through an exhibition where the school community is invited to view and assess products created by students.

Stage 3 Transdisciplinary Program – How the World Works – 'Courage to Speak up' -This series of *Science and Technology, History* and *English* lessons are a part of the transdisciplinary unit exploring the natural world and its laws and the interaction between the natural world and human societies. In this unit, students will examine factors that influence voice and authority through an exploration into Australia's history of federation and democracy. They will discuss themes of equality, empathy and kindness in the English concept unit 'saving wildlife, saving our future'. Students will recognise that our differences are what makes us equal and that we must all be treated fairly. Students will research issues surrounding endangered animals and the importance of conservation, thus recognising the impact losing these species will have on our personal lives. They will learn to speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who share this planet, and extend their understanding to events of real-life significance impacting their present and future selves. In Science and Technology, students will be given opportunities to design sustainable products, systems or environments individually and/or collaboratively considering the properties of materials. This supports their growing understanding of real-world innovative techniques and enables them to question, plan and conduct scientific investigations, collect and summarise data and communicate using scientific representations. The skills and knowledge developed here will directly support students with their 'Courage to Speak up' project and assessment task.

History - Australia as a Nation - Students will investigate the formation of an Australian Federation. They will study the origins of our system of national government and learn about the key figures and reasons for uniting as a nation. They will critically analyse the different attitudes towards federation at the time and research the development of our constitution. Through analysis of primary and secondary sources, students will identify the key elements of our system of government and investigate its origins. They will learn about the Magna Carta and investigate the Westminster and American political systems to help them identify their influences on the development of the Australian system of government. In this unit, the students describe and explain the struggles for rights and freedoms in Australia in the 20th Century. They examine Australian human rights, past and present, including the status and rights of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples and children. The students explain how Australian society has changed throughout the 20th Century for these groups and investigate the significance of the Mabo Decision.

Physical Education - Dance - During PE this term, Stage 3 students will develop their skills, confidence and creativity as they experience various dance styles including hip hop, funk, modern pop and contemporary through the Footsteps Dance Program.

Library ICT Capabilities lessons - Stage 3: Collaborative Project Inventors

Students learn about 'How the world works' through 'leaders in me' and Digital technologies. Stage 3 strand focuses on understanding the role individual components of digital systems play in the processing and representing data. Students design, modify and follow algorithms involving branching and iteration. Stage 3 of this strand further develops students' knowledge and understanding of project management, abstraction and the relationship between models and the real-world systems they represent. An authentic link to the 'Living World' strand through library reading, Digital influx modules and exhibit design excursion to Taronga Zoo.

Via inquiry, students investigate personal and social capabilities of self-awareness by assessing their strengths and challenges and devise personally appropriate strategies to achieve future success. This would develop an appreciation and diverse perspectives, contribute to civil society, and understand emotions from local and global perspectives. Students further develop their abilities by creating and communicating with ICT where they use ICT to prepare simple plans to find solutions or answers to questions. They also use this information by purposefully selecting ICT tools safely to share and exchange information with appropriate local audiences.

School Hours

Our school hours are between 8.30am to 3.00pm. Recess is between 11.00am to 11.30am. Lunch is between 1.30pm to 2.00pm.

For duty of care reasons, please note that students cannot arrive at school before 8.30am. If you need to drop your child to school earlier than this, please make a Before School booking with our onsite Wesley OOSH.

School starts promptly at 9.00am. Please ensure your child is at school by this time so we can start our learning straight away! If you do happen to arrive late, please go to the office to get a late note.

Absences If

your child has been away, please send a note to the office detailing the reason for their absence so we can update our records. If you do not send a note, the office will ask you to fill in an absence form. If you are going on holiday during term time, please inform both the teacher and the office. For absences over ten days, please send a letter to the principal requesting a leave of absence.

Sports and Homework

Students are asked to wear their sports uniform, which includes a school hat and joggers for their sports day. PE will be completed based on class timetables and Sport will be on FRIDAY.

Homework will be weekly spelling words, Literacy activities on Studyladder and Mathematics revision on Mathletics. Students will be required to bring in a labelled A4 workbook from home. Homework will be handed out on a Monday and will be due on Friday.
