Dear Parents/Caregivers,

Welcome back to Preschool for Term 3 of the 2023 school year. We are very excited to be back and settled into our routine after the holiday break.

We are looking forward to a busy and exciting term ahead, as we jump right back into our learning. The Preschool team continue to see such amazing growth from all students across all developmental domains. This newsletter is to remind you of school and class routines and to help you prepare your child for the term ahead.

School Hours

Preschool hours are between 9:00 am to 3.00pm sharp.

The Emus will now attend on Mondays and Tuesdays for Term 3 and Term 4.

The Wombats pick up a day and attend on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday.

For duty of care reasons, please note that students must be signed in and out by a parent or carer at drop off or pick up.

Preschool starts promptly 9.00am and finishes promptly at 3:00pm. Please ensure your child is at school by this time so we can start our learning straight away! If you do happen to arrive late, please go to the school office, via Gate 1 (the main school gate) to sign your child into the premises and get a late note. This will register your child as being on the school grounds. You will also need to sign your child into preschool on the preschool sign in/out sheet once walking them down to the preschool classroom.

Drop off /Pick up Arrangements.

As COVID restrictions and requirements have now ceased, we can happily invite you back into the Preschool space for morning drop off. Please feel free to enter the classroom, assist your child to conduct their morning routine of unpacking their bags and washing their hands and sign your child in on the sign in/out sheet. This process can occur after the Preschool teacher has invited you into the building, and we kindly ask for you to remain waiting in the playground area with your child until this invitation has been given. This ensures that we are always meeting duty of care for all students.

For duty of care reasons, please note that children must also be signed in and out by a parent or carer at drop off and pick up. If you have organised a friend or family member to pick up your child, please ensure they bring photo I.D.

If you need to leave early for an appointment, please pick up an early leaver's pass from the office.

If you are going to be late to pick-up, after 3 pm, you will need to contact the office on 9622 2136, prior to the 3pm bell. Any children left at Preschool after 3:10PM will be taken to the office for collection.

Absences

If your child is going to be absent from preschool, please contact the office via phone 9622 2136 or email sevenhillw-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au to let Preschool know that your child will be absent for the day. As part of our student-led curriculum focus that is aligning with the K-6 cohort, Preschool will be working on 4 learning goals under the "Goal Getters" initiative. These goals will have a reading, numeracy, wellbeing, and attendance focus. As such, we please ask that our Emus and Wombats attend preschool on their given days to help them to meet their attendance goal.

Recess and Lunch

Please remember to pack healthy food in your child's lunch box.

Following our preschool vision to be sustainable in all of our practices, we encourage "nude" (package free) food – some ideas to include could be: cut up fruit, vegetables, popcorn, yoghurt or cheese for morning tea and a sandwich, salad, sushi or pasta for lunch.

Please note that we are a NUT AWARE service – please do not pack nuts or nut-based products in your child's lunchbox. We have students enrolled in preschool who have nut allergies. We also have students who are allergic to poppyseeds. We kindly ask you to assist us in ensuring the safety of students with allergies, by attempting to not send foods to preschool that contain poppy seeds.

Please only send drink bottles with water. Preschool foods posters are available for parents to view should you require further ideas.

To assist us in maintaining a streamlined morning and lunch routine, please place your child's morning tea and lunch into separate, labelled containers. Once at Preschool your child will unpack his/her own bag by putting these items on the appropriate lunchbox trollies.

Birthdays at Preschool – If you would like to send a treat with your child to Preschool to celebrate their birthday, we ask that food items being sent, don't contain nuts, and are also individually wrapped. Students will be given the treats to take home and enjoy.

Library

Our Preschool children have the opportunity to visit and borrow from the Seven Hills West Public School library. Each child has received a library bag with their name on it. Please return the book each week so that your child will be able to borrow a new book to take home.

Important Information

- Notes explaining your child's absence are required when students are absent from school. Students who are taking extended leave need to notify the Principal in advance, via the school office.
- Parents/caregivers are encouraged to check StoryPark, SHWPS 'Spotlight' newsletter, the school's website http://www.sevenhillw-p.schools.nsw.edu.au and Facebook page for reminders and upcoming events.
- An appointment needs to be made if you would like to discuss any concerns with your child's class teacher. Please contact the front office to make an appointment with your child's teacher.


OUR VISION


OUR PHILOSOPHY
